Filing of the government's salary proposals

The government's proposal, submitted on November 30th, does not at all meet the expectations of the members of the organizations that make up the Common Front. The government's proposal only offers 7% to cover all the labour costs, maintain salary equity, retirement, etc., which does not in any way guarantee a salary increase for the workers.

Nevertheless, a study by the *Institut de la statistique du Québec*, published last week, concluded that the salaries

paid in the civil service and in the health and education network are 8.7% less than those paid in other sectors of the economy. The government must act now to attract qualified manpower and to retain those with experience. Offering a competitive salary to this manpower is therefore a necessity. So, the government's proposal does not offer any solution to the labour shortage, because it contributes rather to the deterioration of working conditions in public services.

The content of the government's proposal is being presented to the FIQ delegates at the Federal Council of December 3, 2009.

On December 3, the Federation will take advantage of the fact that the delegates are meeting at the Federal Council to commemorate the events at the Polytechnique that occurred 20 years ago. This annual commemoration is very important for the Federation which always marks the event in memory of the fourteen young women assassinated by a man that didn't like women or their advancement in society.


Infection Control Handbook
