AN HISTORICAL MEETING

A first in the history of negotiations in the public and parapublic sectors: 3,000 delegates from the negotiation decision-making bodies of each of the members of the Common Front (SISP-CSN-FTQ) met in Quebec City on Monday, February 22, 2010.

AN IMPORTANT **DEMONSTRATION**

The delegates demonstrated in front of the National Assembly to remind the government of their desire to conclude an agreement before March 31 which will include decent working conditions that respect these employees.

The delegation also had the opportunity to hear different speakers who came specifically to discuss the importance of public services in Quebec society. Alexa Conradi, President of the Fédération des femmes du Québec, Jean-Claude Germain, Historian and Professor Jean-Noël Grenier were the speakers.

A press conference was held alongside this meeting in order to give an update on the progress of the work at the negotiation tables.













CALL FOR MOBILIZATION



To speed up the negotiations, the members of the Common Front organizations, including those of the FIQ, need to be united and mobilized in order to maintain the pressure on the government to make them see reason.

PROGRESS REPORT ON NEGOTIATIONS

The Coordination Team, composed of Sylvie Savard, Ginette Raymond, Francine Savard and Serge Prévost, presented a progress report on the negotiations to the FIQ delegation at the Special Federal Council.

INTERSECTORIAL NEGOTIATIONS

The offers from the Conseil du trésor regarding salary remain the same, that is a 7% increase in the labour costs of which 5% is slated for a salary increase (1st year: 0.5%, 2nd year: 0.75%, 3rd year: 1%, 4th year: 1.25% and 5th year: 1.5%) and 2% for assuming the costs linked to maintaining salary equity, salary relativity, the pension plans and the corrections for the sectorial problems.

RETIREMENT

A meeting was held on February 18 with the Conseil du trésor. There are still disagreements between the parties.

- The management party refuses indexation.
