## An historic encampment

The historic encampment of the care professionals was dismantled at 10:00 on Friday, June 11. The Federation activists would have spent 78 hours in front of the National Assembly in order to remind the MNAs that it is crucial and urgent to reach a settlement in the current negotiations. The FIQ still hopes that a settlement can be reached before the summer, in spite of the end of Parliament's session.

## Waiting for the negotiation blitz

The president of the Conseil du trésor announced on Thursday that they want to start a negotiation blitz, a sign that she is prepared to make the needed effort to sign an agreement. The FIQ representatives are now waiting to hear when these new discussions will start. However, there is no question for the care professionals of accepting a settlement which would mean little significant improvement or a setback in their working conditions which are already inhuman.
