Two petitions to sign

Seeking greater justice for workers

The FIQ is inviting its members to sign two petitions seeking to put an end to certain alarming injustices that workers who are victims of industrial accidents and occupational diseases suffer.

The first petition seeks to abolish the *Bureau d'évaluation médicale* (BÉM), a tool for medical contestation available for the employers, while the second asks for an end to the penalties imposed on the victims of industrial accidents and occupational diseases.

The time limit to sign the two petitions on the National Assembly web site is February 21, 2011.

Anti strike-breaker provisions

The SISP is demanding changes to the Labour Code

The Secrétariat intersyndical des services publics (SISP), in which the FIQ is a member, is asking the government to review the anti strike-breaker provisions stipulated in the Labour Code in order to ensure that the balance of power is maintained during a strike or lockout. It is a question of avoiding that a worker on strike or lockout be replaced by someone else, regardless of the workplace or the technologies used to do this work.
