Through a petition, Avaaz, an online global movement which gives citizens the means to influence global politics, is launching an appeal to all five parties

making up the federal government and to the Auditor General to demand that the report on the expenses for the G8 Summit be made public. There is no law preventing the Auditor General from immediately making this report public. Canadians have the right to know the truth about the G8 expenses before choosing their next government on May 2.

To date, nearly 80,000 people have signed the petition declaring they are in favour of the report being disclosed.

Negotiations of the Canada-European Union

The SISP denounces the lack of transparency



While a 7th round of negotiations recently took place in Ottawa in order to reach a Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement between Canada and the European Union, the *Secrétariat intersyndical des services publics* (SISP), representing 330,000 people working in public services in Quebec, decided to join its voice to that of the *Réseau québécois sur l'intégration continentale* (RQIC) to denounce the lack of transparency in these

negotiations. This treaty will affect the capacity of governments and the provinces to protect their public services from foreign competition.

This treaty, which will have major consequences on labour rights and labour legislation, could harm the respect of international instruments and Quebec laws on labour relations.
