Proposed regulation on the practice of the respiratory therapy profession as a corporate entity


The FIQ has informed the government that it is against the adoption of such a regulation through comments sent to the *Office des professions du Québec*. Concerns were also addressed to the *Ordre professionnel des inhalothérapeutes du Québec* (OPIQ) who initiated this project. This regulation would essentially allow respiratory therapists to incorporate their professional services. The Federation believes this is encouraging the labour force to leave for the private sector or to practice as subcontractors in the public institutions.

freely apply pressure tactics, a society in which the economy is at the service of the population and not the reverse, and a society in which the values of justice, equality and solidarity are promoted.

Bill 78 criticized by the UNO

Bill 78, imposed by the Charest government, was the subject of strong criticism from the high commissioner for human rights at the United Nations who said that it was disappointing to see our government restrict the students' right to freedom of association and to peaceful assembly. In a release dated June 17, the UNO also indicated that it would add Canada to its list of the worst abusers of human rights. Bill 78 has direct impacts on the healthcare professionals who are no longer allowed to carry out spontaneous demonstrations, among others, to denounce their working conditions.
