The FIQ welcomes the election of Pauline Marois

The day after the elections, the Federation welcomed the election of Pauline Marois, the first woman to head the Government of Québec.

Although the public chose to put a minority government in power, the Federation hopes that all members of the government have gotten a clear message. Partisan politics has no place in the National Assembly and all the parties must collaborate in order to best meet the needs of Quebecers.

Even if the issue of health care wasn't at the centre of the electoral campaign, it ranks same among the major concerns just the same and that is why the FIQ hopes that the government performs a pronounced and needed change in the management of the healthcare network. The words "take care" should now be found at the heart of the healthcare system.

The SISP recalls the promises made by the *Parti québécois* during the electoral campaign

The Secrétariat intersyndical des services publics (SISP) also welcomed the election of Pauline Marois to the position of premier by emphasizing that it is the first time in 145 years that a woman has become the head of the Government of Québec.

The SISP hopes that the elected politicians for the *Parti québécois* will show as much openness for the concerns of the government workers as they did during the electoral campaign. Questioned on several issues by the SISP, the *Parti québécois* voiced several commitments in August, including, among others, the abolition of the health tax and the fight against tax havens.
